- accept full responsibility for their safety and behaviour
- accept that WhitCamp and its safety measures will be in a state of unreadiness, therefore...
- be vigilant for them and brief your boys to be vigilant before and during this time
- advise your boys that there will be limited opportunities for them.

4. DBS Registration and Safeguarding Training

All volunteers need an Enhanced DBS Disclosure from the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS). This process can take weeks and must be completed as it is an essential to be a volunteer on WhitCamp. Also essential is completion of a one hour on line Safeguarding training course. Following completion of this form a link to the training site will be sent to you.

7. David Chilcott Fund

The David Chilcott Fund is a registered charity, and is named after a boy that attended WhitCamp, but then tragically died in an accident. Its purpose is to help young people attend Christian holidays, courses and conferences, which they would otherwise not be able to afford, by contributing financially to the costs of the event and travelling to it. The Fund contributes to around 475 young people each year, donating approximately £37k. The fund in 2017 had a historic high in requests for support, and a need for more support.
